Ste. Genevieve County Community Center Aquatic Center Rules and Guidelines

General Rules

- ➤ We require one (1) guardian to be in the water for every four (4) kids swimming.
- All flotation devices must be US Coast Guard Approved and anyone wearing a flotation device or that cannot swim must always have an adult in the water within arm's length reach.
- > Certified lifeguards are on duty at all times for your safety.
- > Obey lifeguards at all times.
- **Everyone must shower before entering the pool.**
- No running or horseplay in or around the pool area.
- An adult must accompany children under 10 years of age at all times.
- > Proper swimsuit attire is required. No cut-offs or thongs.
- > Street shoes are not allowed on the pool deck.
- > Chewing gum in not allowed in the pool.
- > Food, drink, glass, or coolers are not allowed in the pool area. Ste. Genevieve County Community Center reserves the right to check baggage if deemed appropriate.
- > Ste. Genevieve County Community Center is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged personal items. Lockers are available in the facility.
- > NO admittance will be give to anyone under the influence of alcohol or other intoxicating substances.
- > No one will be admitted into the pool with casts (unless it is waterproof), open wounds, a rash or an infectious or communicable disease.
- > No toys or inflatables allowed.
- > Diapers are not allowed in the pool, swim diapers are required. Swim diapers are available for purchase at the Community Center.
- > No hanging on the lane ropes.
- > SCUBA equipment is not allowed during public swimming sessions.
- Kickboards, pull buoys, and hand paddles are only to be used for lap swimming and swim team practices.
- > The Ste. Genevieve County Community Center reserves the right to add additional rules, which may be necessary for the safe operation of the pool.
- Management exercises the right to take action on any circumstance in which it feels it would in the best interest of the public to do so.
- No diving.
- > Do not swim in slide exit area.

Water Slide Rules

- > Swimmers must be 48 inches or taller to go down slide. No exceptions.
- > Swimmers using the slide must go down the slide feet first, in a sitting position or lying on their back.
- > Only one person is allowed on the slide at a time. (No partners, riding with parents, or trains)
- ➤ Goggles, masks, fins, watches, zippers, buckles, life jackets, or floatation devices may not be worn while using the slide.
- > Swimsuits with metal rivets are not allowed on the slide.
- > Spinning or flipping while going down the slide is not allowed.
- > Keep arms, hands, legs, and feet inside the flume at all times.
- > Please refrain from stopping on the slide.
- > Individuals using the slide must exit at the nearest ladder.
